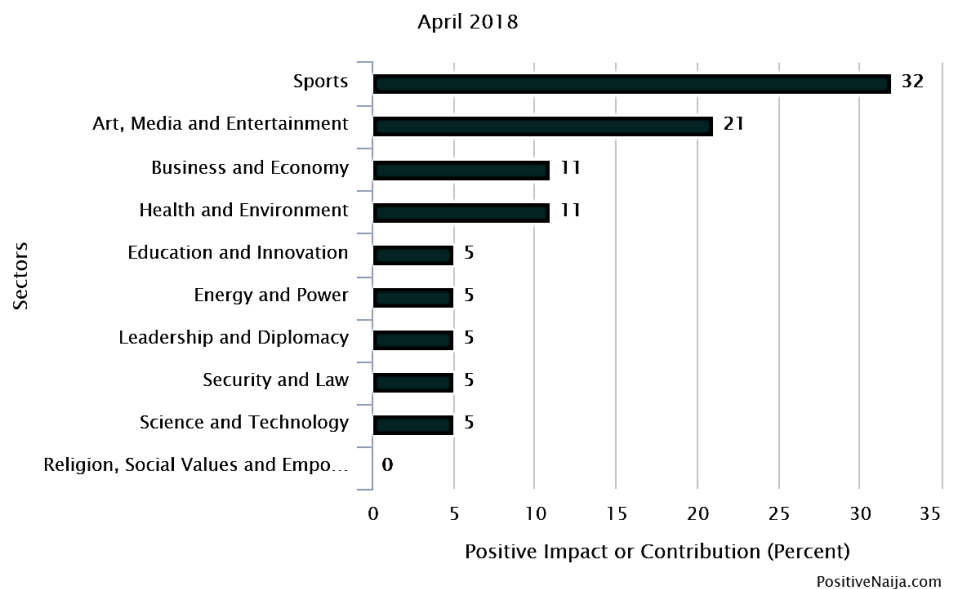

1. Team Nigeria Wins 24 Medals At 2018 Commonwealth Games

Nigeria finished the 2018 Commonwealth Games, in Australia in 9th place with a total of 24 medals which included nine gold, nine silver and six bronze.

2. Professor Fola Tayo

Professor Fola Tayo has been appointed by the World Health Organisation (WHO) to serve on its Cancer Medicine Advisory Group for the availability and affordability of cancer medicines.

Among the 14 eminent people appointed, Prof. Tayo is the only West African appointed to serve on the group.

3. Publisээр Joins IPDA

4. Ayodeji Olarinoye

6. ColdHubs

ColdHubs Nigeria has emerged as the overall winner of the 2018 Africa Energy Ideas Competition at the Nigerian Energy Forum (NEF) with its *Solar Cold Room* innovation.

7. Oluwatofunmi Oteju

16-year-old Oluwatofunmi Oteju has been awarded the Emerging Leader of the Year award for 2018 by Augsburg University, United States of America.
