

1. Nigerian Prisons Service

The Nigerian Prisons Service (NPS) has emerged winner of the 2018 UNESCO Confucius Prize for Literacy due to an education for prisoners' programme being run by the National Open University of Nigeria (NOUN).

The NPS was awarded a silver medal, a diploma and \$20,000 prize money as well as a trip to the birthplace of Confucius.

2. Covenant University

Covenant University has emerged number one in the list of the top 5 institutions globally, by scholarly output, in the field of Option Pricing; Hedging; Black-Scholes Equation according to the latest computations by Elsevier's SciVal.

3. 2018 World Choir Olympics

Five Nigerian choirs have been honoured at the 2018 World Choir Olympics with gold and silver laurels in different categories.

The five Nigerian choirs were: Lagos City Chorale, Mountain Top Chorale, New Wine Chorale, Musica Casa and Riverbank School Choir.

Nigeria was also represented at the bi-annual meeting of World Choir Council by Sir Emeka Nwokedi.
