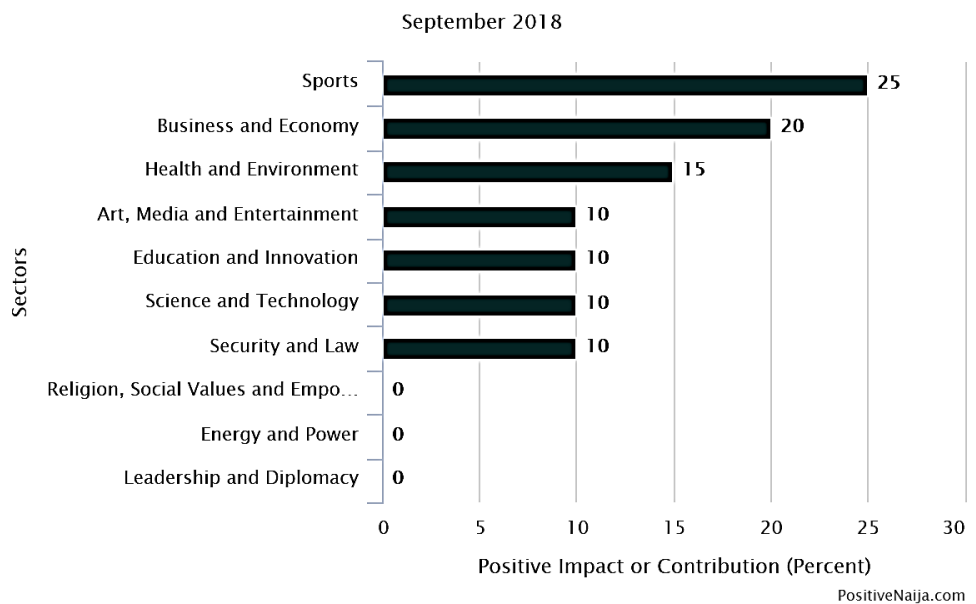

1. D'Tigress

D'Tigress, Nigeria's women basketball team excelled at the 2018 FIBA Women's Basketball World Cup reaching the quarterfinal in only their second appearance.

D'Tigress defeated Turkey, Argentina and Greece to become the first African team to qualify for the quarterfinals.

2. Covenant University

The Times Higher Education World University Rankings has rated Covenant University as one of the top 700 universities in the world.

Ranked 636 in the world, Covenant University is rated based on Teachings, Research, Citations, Industry Income and International Outlook.

Covenant University hereby becomes the first private university in Nigeria, second private university in Africa to feature in the top 1000 rankings. Covenant University (2002) and University of Johannesburg (2005) also become the youngest universities from Africa to feature in the ranking.

3. Nigeria Floorball Team

The Nigeria Floorball team has emerged African Champions of the First African Floorball Cup defeating Burkina Faso in Abidjan, Cote D'Ivoire.

4. International Institute of Tropical Agriculture (IITA)

The International Institute of Tropical Agriculture (IITA) has been awarded the 2018 Africa Food Prize award for leadership and innovation in finding solutions to major concerns affecting Africa's agriculture sector.

IITA receives \$100,000 cash prize and a trophy of recognition.

5. Aruna Quadri

Nigeria's Aruna Quadri and Egypt's Dina Meshref emerge winners of the men and women's singles event at the 2018 ITTF African Championships in Mauritius.

6. Vinsighte

Kolawole Tomisin and Erioluwa Morenikeji, from the University of Ibadan have emerged 1st prize winners of ₦1.5 million for their initiative – Vinsighte, in the Union Bank Campus Innovation Challenge held in Lagos.

Vinsighte is a health technology project that makes use of technology to help blind and visually impaired persons live a happier, more comfortable life.

7. RecyclePoints

South Africa's *Wala*, Nigeria's *RecyclePoints* and Kenya's *Tulaa* have emerged top three winners in the 2018 Zambezi Prize for innovation in financial inclusion.
